Mission, Vision...Action in 2023!

It was such a blessing to participate in Rejoice Sunday and conduct interviews with congregation members about what they most value about this church and where they hope God will take us in the future. As the congregation reflects on my role and votes on my continuing call with First in February, I am grateful that with the Mission Team's work we have recently had a chance to do some of this important work.

When I was an interim in my last call, I was excited about where the congregation the plans we made for its future mission but couldn't be a part of it. When I first came to First, I shared a vision for how we might move forward together and a process for the congregation to prepare for action. At the onset of my time here I said that my presence and position here would be dependent on people showing up and participating...and then we got a pandemic where we told people not to show up and participation became a challenge for many people. But we adapted and our ability to adapt and change directions has become a valuable characteristic of the congregation and leadership.

At First, while we've faced challenges and twists and turns in our transition work, I am excited about where we are and where we are going. In this next phase, we get to launch into more action and the "doing" phase of our mission work. What we do is so much more powerful when we do it together and when we have more clarity about why we are doing what we are doing!

Three years in, I can look back on my time with pride in what we have already accomplished and what we have to build on and cultivate. While we have not had the participation that I hoped for in many aspects of our ministry, we have shown many promising signs of life and renewed potential when we do show up and participate. I hope in the coming months with greater direction, purpose and action more of our community members will be motivated to gather around this work and support it wherever they are. Because we believe in our mission and want to share in it...not as a task or responsibility that feels like a burden, but as an opportunity to be together and do things that connect us with Jesus and his life-giving kingdom!

First Lutheran Gather and Go Opportunities!

In 2023, we will have many opportunities to gather in greater numbers and invite the community, including people that may be looking for a church home, into our church and congregational life. On Wednesdays during Lent (starting in March) we will be having a simple meal together with a short service and message. This will take place in Hammerling Hall from 5-6pm. Please make a plan to come at least once and contact the office if you can host one of the meals!



This summer a pulpit exchange with our church neighbors will help us partner more and grow in mission with these neighboring churches.

What Is A Healing Service?

Prayer is central to our congregation's life and experiencing healing in worship helps us bring healing to our relationships and communities. Every other month, First Lutheran takes time to gather in a worship that includes lighting prayer candles at the cross and having an opportunity to receive a blessing and prayer of healing from the pastor with special oil from the Holy Land. Please make a plan to come and share in this unique worship experience.

Holden Evening Prayer

Holden Evening Prayer was written in 1985-86 by Marty Haugen during a musical residency at Holden Village. Holden Evening Prayer is a simple Lutheran vespers service that follows traditional form while using contemporary and inclusive language.

WHY SHOULD WE OBSERVE LENT?



This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that begins on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes. Lent helps us STOP, LOOK and LISTEN. We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest awhile — and to stop

sinning. Lent tells us to LOOK inward for an honest self-examination, to look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and love, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection. And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN — to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit. STOP, LOOK and LISTEN! These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent.




