God is doing some really interesting and wonderful things through the First community, and we have

had a chance in this last month to test our capacity for change and new events. You can look at vibrant photos of events and activities in this newsletter to see what God has been up to here!

Our latest event, Trivia Happy Hour on April 30th hosted by our council secretary Gayle's son Michael Falk, who won the Jeopardy Tournament of Champions in 2006, is an event that invites collaboration and creativity through our little church! In the Vision Statement we adopted at our Annual Meeting in February we said, "We will be seen as a vibrant and imaginative congregation and a resource in many communities and networks, as we connect with our neighbors locally and worldwide." The last month of activity we wasted no time living into that vision!

We were good stewards of our church home with 12 members and friends participate in Spring Cleaning at First, installing a new sound system and painting the sanctuary walls in time for Holy Week Services! We hosted an Easter Egg Hunt, in cooperation with former Saint John's members, that was enjoyed by 70 community members. Many parents and grandparents were emotionally grateful for this experience of grace when I talked with them at the door before and after the experience. I loved seeing how our Sunday School kids stepped up in leadership roles for the Hunt-welcoming and personally interacting with the kids that came— and also being a part of worship service in the First Lutheran Players Palm Sunday Play. We hosted five ecumenical congregations for an incredibly moving "Seven Last Cries of Jesus" service on Good Friday, featuring diverse voices and music. It was one of the most meaningful services I have experienced and I have heard similar responses from those who participated.

- A Listening Team will be formed in the fall to connect with our neighbors and neighborhood to assess what needs and interests are identified that First could respond to.

We are creating an infrastructure for active ministry, and learning to be a church that moves with the speed of the Holy Spirit! Thank you for all the time and talents you have given as a part of First Lutheran. I look forward to growing in faith, serving with joy and sharing God's many blessings together as part of this community of believers.


Save your ink!
